


# LEGAL AID IS FAIRNESS

People deserve results. In 2015, Legal Aid of Western Missouri provided free legal aid to more than 13,000 of low-income Missourians. Together, with our network of community partners, we worked hard to change, improve and save lives.



### **BRENDA**


Brenda came to Legal Aid for help obtaining a custody order for her two children. The children's father, Wayne, was in prison at the time for robbery and domestic assault.

Wayne had abused and harassed Brenda for almost a decade. He punched her in the face repeatedly, kicked her in the face and stomach, tried to steer her car off the road while she and the children were inside, threatened to blow up her car and to burn down her home, slashed her tires, broke into her home and destroyed her property and told her "If I can't have you, no one can."

The children witnessed much of this abuse. Over the years, Brenda had obtained three orders of protection against Wayne, but Wayne simply ignored the orders, calling and texting Brenda hundreds of times.

Even though he was incarcerated, Wayne hired an attorney to try to get custody of the children. The court appointed a Guardian ad Litem. Wayne was released on parole and began visits with the children. Three months later, he was back in jail for assault. His parents intervened in the case and requested third party visitation. Ultimately, Wayne consented to Brenda having sole legal and sole physical custody of the children. Wayne will have phone contact but no visitation with the children. His parents will have visitation with the children for one weekend each month.

Brenda is happy her children will not be exposed to Wayne's violent behavior. She will be able to make all the decisions affecting her children without having to interact with her abuser. Her family will be safe and intact.



## WELDON

Weldon is a disabled man living on a small fixed income. He contacted Legal Aid after his home was foreclosed on and he faced imminent eviction. Due to his disability, Weldon was unable to find appropriate housing quickly and needed to delay his eviction.

In reviewing Weldon's case, his Legal Aid attorney realized that his mortgage company had violated several federal regulations by repeatedly denying his requests for a modification of his FHA-insured loan to reduce his interest rate and payment. Legal Aid represented Weldon in filing a bankruptcy case to delay the eviction and then filed a lawsuit against the mortgage company due to its violations of federal and state law in connection with Weldon's loan. Initially the mortgage company fought the lawsuit, but finally agreed that the foreclosure sale be set aside. The lender modified the terms of the loan to reduce Weldon's interest rate and payment to an affordable amount and brought his loan current.

After years of worrying that he would lose his home, Weldon now has a mortgage payment that he can afford and he feels confident that this will be his home for many years to come.



## **JUANITA**

Juanita contacted Legal Aid regarding beneficiary deed services. Her husband had recently fallen ill and she wanted to have a succession plan in place for their home.

As Juanita's husband was not able to make it to the Legal Aid office, the attorney and paralegal on the project met the couple at their home to sign and notarize their beneficiary deed. Together, they chose to name a trusted family member as the beneficiary to their home upon their passing.

Juanita then asked the team to get in contact with her father who lives nearby and wanted a beneficiary deed for his home as well. Legal Aid staff spoke with Juanita's father, did an intake for him and drafted a beneficiary deed for his home. He chose to name Juanita, his daughter, as the beneficiary to his home upon his passing.

Within the span of a couple weeks, Legal Aid staff signed, notarized and recorded two beneficiary deeds for one family. When the current homeowners pass away, the homes will pass smoothly and immediately to the loved ones they chose. Juanita and her father can rest assured that their homes will remain in the family, instead of becoming forgotten or abandoned.



### **PATRICIA**

Patricia spent her childhood in and out of state custody. As an adult, she ended up in a series of abusive relationships. One of her abusers hit her head with a hammer so hard that she suffered a traumatic head injury. For many years Patricia was homeless, in and out of shelters, while suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, complications from the traumatic brain injury and auditory hallucinations.

In 2013, the Family Support Division (FSD) proposed to terminate Patricia's Medicaid benefits. The FSD determined that her health conditions had improved and found her no longer disabled. Patricia was distraught. She had recently had knee surgery, was suffering from chronic pain in addition to her many other serious mental health issues. Patricia was worried about what would happen to her if she no longer had access to the medical care she so desperately needed. She contacted Legal Aid for help.

Patricia's Legal Aid attorney gathered her medical records and requested a hearing to appeal the proposed termination. The Legal Aid attorney reviewed Patricia's file at the Family Support Division and discovered that the file did not contain medical records from several of the medical providers and some of the medical records were for an entirely different person. Patricia's Legal Aid attorney represented her at the appeal hearing and argued that Patricia's health had not improved.

Thanks to Legal Aid, the decision to terminate was overturned and Patricia can continue receiving much-needed medical care.

#### **OUR MAIN PRACTICE AREAS**

Family Law/Domestic Violence Protection: For more than 30 years, Legal Aid's largest practice area has been domestic violence intervention. Legal Aid's experienced family law advocates help ensure lasting safety for survivors of domestic violence and their children.

We provide legal representation to low-income survivors of abuse and secure protective orders, establish paternity, obtain divorces and establish child custody and child support orders. Due to our limited resources, our Family Law attorneys are only able to accept cases that involve domestic violence and priority is given to those in which children are at risk.

Effective legal representation, combined with our ability to refer clients to other community resources for assistance with non-legal matters, has proven to be one of the most effective means of stopping domestic violence for our clients. With Legal Aid's assistance, domestic violence survivors are able to achieve physical safety and financial security. With this support, victims are more likely to leave their abusers and have the personal and financial capacity to establish a life free from abuse.

Housing Assistance: Legal Aid's housing advocates provide a broad array of legal services to clients living in poverty. We focus on public housing and other federally subsidized housing. The Housing Authority of Kansas City's public housing and section 8 voucher programs alone include 10,000 families. Legal Aid is the attorney for the Public Housing Resident Council of HAKC.

We also represent people with disabilities who have accessibility or accommodation challenges

needing resolution so they may equally enjoy housing as nondisabled tenants do. We help other clients with eligibility disputes for public and subsidized housing. Our housing attorneys and paralegals regularly provide advice or representation to help our clients avoid wrongful evictions, secure wrongfully withheld security deposits and correct improper rent calculations.

We step in to help residents when there is a systemic problem in a development, such as repairs not being made or rent being calculated incorrectly, in order to make sure the problem is corrected for everyone, not just a single person.

Foreclosure Prevention: Saving the homes of low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners from foreclosure is a Legal Aid priority. Through litigation in state and federal courts, we challenge deficiencies in the foreclosure process and frequently are able to stop foreclosure sales or to set aside legally invalid sales.

Legal Aid also negotiates directly with loan servicers to pursue loss mitigation options, including loan modifications to reduce interest rates and payments. We counsel homeowners and tenants on their legal options before and after a home is foreclosed and provide legal representation when needed.

Economic Development: Legal Aid's Economic Development Unit represents nonprofit community organizations in neighborhood improvement activities, including the creation of low-income housing in Kansas City. Staff attorneys provide legal assistance to neighborhood associations seeking to remedy vacant and blighted homes, to nonprofit social service providers for low-income

residents and to community development corporations seeking to rehabilitate and develop residential units in their neighborhoods. Legal services include property acquisition, financing, real estate closing and syndication, tax abatement, zoning and contracts with service providers.

Federal Benefits: Legal Aid provides assistance to clients with federal benefit claims. Staff represent clients in administrative hearings and in court to ensure they receive the public benefits to which they are entitled. Typical claims involve benefits such as Social Security, Supplemental Security Income and Medicare.

Health Care/State Benefits: Legal Aid represents people who experience problems with state-administered public assistance programs. These programs include MO HealthNet for the Aged, Blind and Disabled (Medicaid), Medicaid Spend Down, Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB), Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB), temporary assistance, food stamps, childcare assistance, Blind Pension, Supplemental Aid to the Blind and home and community-based services, among others.

Legal Aid also provides assistance to families, children and pregnant women to obtain and maintain Medicaid coverage. We provide legal representation to individual clients at administrative hearings and in negotiations with state agencies. We also provide advice and counsel to clients regarding eligibility requirements for public benefits programs. Our partnerships with Mosaic Life Care and other regional healthcare providers grants access to medical care for hundreds of low-income people every year.

We do extensive outreach to educate the community about public benefits. This outreach improves the quality of our clients' lives through increased access to healthcare, food assistance and income support programs.


**Consumer:** Legal Aid advises and represents low-income clients, particularly seniors living on Social Security, in a variety of consumer issues. These include cases involving utility shutoffs, predatory loans, home repair, warranty claims, illegal and unfair debt collection practices and other debtor-creditor issues.

Immigration Law Project: Legal Aid staff represents individuals and their families in immigration cases to evaluate immigration benefit options and the potential to receive a waiver of immigration application fees, if applicable. Legal Aid staff provides comprehensive services and advice to assist individuals and families in obtaining United States citizenship, including those who are applying with a medical disability, residence status for family members, renewing or replacing resident cards for permanent residents, and aid conditional residents, refugees, and asylees in applying to obtain permanent resident status.

Legal Aid also provides assistance to United States citizens to apply for US passports or proof of citizenship status obtained from an US citizen parent.

Additionally, Legal Aid works with survivors of violent crimes and domestic violence to provide advice and evaluate immigration benefit options. Legal Aid staff is available for immigration presentations to inform domestic violence shelter caseworkers and other community organizations that assist immigrants.



#### WHERE WE WORK

With offices in downtown Kansas City, Joplin, St. Joseph, Warrensburg and a neighborhood office on Kansas City's Westside, Legal Aid serves a 40-county area where 295,000 people live in poverty.

Joplin: The Joplin office provides services to six counties along Missouri's southwest border. The staff consists of four attorneys, two paralegals and one legal secretary. The majority of cases handled by the Joplin office involve victims of domestic abuse seeking Orders of Protection, marriage dissolution, paternity, custody, visitation and support orders. In addition, the staff handles cases involving consumer matters, landlord/tenant law, social security cases and public benefits.

Many clients have problems beyond the immediate legal issues that brought them to a Legal Aid office. Staff members are active in various organizations that focus on specific issues facing clients, including domestic violence, homelessness and financial stability. Close partnerships with community agencies enable Legal Aid to help clients address these issues.

**Kansas City - Central Office:** The Central office in downtown Kansas City. The staff consists of 33 attorneys, 12 paralegals, 11 administrative staff, two intake specialists, six legal secretaries and three Volunteer Attorney Project staff members.

The Central office is home to Legal Aid's Municipal Court Defense Unit. This program is funded by a contract with the City of Kansas City and provides representation to low-income clients charged with jailable offenses in the City's municipal courts.

Kansas City - West Office: Kansas City's Westside community is served by Legal Aid's bilingual staff located in the office on Southwest Boulevard.

The staff includes five attorneys, one paralegal, a legal secretary and several volunteers. For the past 41 years, this dedicated Legal Aid team has specialized in providing counsel and representation on issues of immigration, economic development, community development and housing.

**St. Joseph:** St. Joseph's staff of nine includes five attorneys and four paralegals serving an 18-county area of northwest Missouri. In addition, the Mosaic Life Care Medical-Legal Partnership project operates with one attorney and two paralegals. These three individuals handle Medicaid appeals.

The St. Joseph office represents a mix of both rural and urban clients. Many of the cases involve family law, including marriage dissolution, custody, guardianships and Orders of Protection. In addition, staff handles cases involving consumer issues, landlord/tenant law, social security cases, unemployment denials, utility shut-offs and other civil matters

Warrensburg: The Warrensburg office serves thirteen rural counties in west central Missouri. The staff consists of four attorneys, three paralegals and one secretary. The Warrensburg staff handles cases involving consumer law, housing, domestic violence, landlord/tenant cases and public benefits issues. The staff maintains a strong presence in the community and works directly with local agencies in several counties. Staff members also make outreach presentations to local groups.

#### **VOLUNTEER ATTORNEY PROJECT**

The Volunteer Attorney Project (VAP) places eligible clients with private attorneys who agree to provide free legal representation to those who otherwise could not afford it. The private attorneys who volunteer their time through VAP believe in the principle of equal access to the legal system, of making "justice for all" more than just a promise. These attorneys are convinced that our legal system must work for all its citizens. They donate their time and considerable talents to make that ideal a reality.

During 2015, VAP attorneys closed 532 cases representing more than 4,944 hours of legal representation, approximately \$988,800 worth of legal services. The following attorneys accepted new VAP cases in 2015.



#### **IDENTITY THEFT THREATENED TIMOTHY'S VA BENEFITS**

Timothy came to Legal Aid's onsite office hours at the Kansas City VA Medical Center needing assistance with a VA benefits overpayment. Timothy's identity had been stolen, and the resulting use of his information caused the VA to believe he had been over paid almost \$25,000 in monetary benefits. Legal Aid helped Timothy compile information regarding his identity theft and drafted an argument for why he should not be held responsible for the debt. Legal Aid then filed a waiver request on Timothy's behalf. The VA agreed to waive the entire debt, and Timothy will receive almost \$13,000 in back benefits.

#### **MARIA**

Maria contacted Legal Aid after she received an audit notice from the IRS regarding her 2013 tax return. She had never received a notice from the IRS before and only hoped she had not inadvertently done something wrong by claiming her grandchildren on her tax return. Maria was especially nervous because she did not have the means to pay back nearly \$10,000 she had received as a refund.

At the interview, the Low Income Taxpayer Clinic attorney learned that Maria's daughter gave birth in early 2013 and stayed in Maria's home with the baby for that year. The daughter did not work, but provided care for the baby and other children. Because the children's father was no longer a part of their lives, Maria worked two minimum-wage jobs to house and financially support her daughter and her three grandchildren. She claimed her grandchildren as dependents on her tax return, as well as the Child Tax Credit and Earned Income Credit.

When her income tax return was audited, Maria attempted to provide the necessary documents to the IRS on her own. However, she was overwhelmed with the audit process and not understanding what else she needed to provide. The LITC attorney represented Maria in the audit appeal. The attorney helped Maria gather supporting documents and wrote a letter of explanation to the IRS. Maria and her daughter believed the children's father might have claimed them, even though they did not live with him and he did not provide financial support. Thus, the LITC attorney preemptively explained that he was not entitled to claim the children.

A month later, Maria received notification of "no change" to her return. She was relieved that she had done nothing wrong, and that she would not need to find a way to pay the IRS back.
